- **Behave like family.** We value relationships and work hard to help our supporters understand that they are the reason for our success.

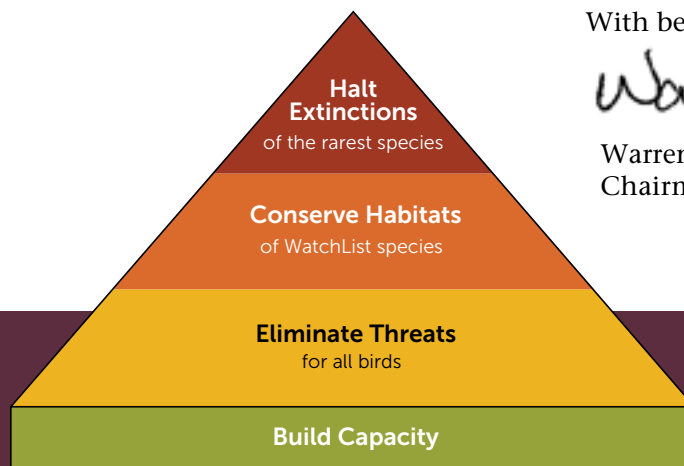
An organization doesn’t need to be huge or selfish in praise to accomplish great things for birds. In fact, we feel much the opposite.

ABC Conservation Framework

An organization doesn’t need to be huge or selfish in praise to accomplish great things for birds.

HALTING EXTINCTIONS

Preventing the extinction of the rarest birds is essential to ABC's mission. In 2015 alone, we helped partner organizations in 12 Latin American countries protect core habitat for bird species at 26 Alliance for Zero Extinction (AZE) sites. We also expanded or established reserves in six countries that protect more than 6,000 acres of additional bird habitat.

In Hawai'i, where so many birds have gone extinct and native forest birds teeter on the brink, ABC's ability to protect declining populations grows each year.

Protecting Rare Brazilian Birds

Stretching for thousands of miles along the Brazilian coastline, the Atlantic Forest is still a place where one can see thousands of unusual plants and animals. These species are uniquely adapted to this ecosystem and found nowhere else on Earth. Yet because of intense human development in the region, the forest is now just 8 percent of its original extent. In some places it has disappeared almost completely.

At ABC, we continue to step up our work to save rare birds of the Atlantic Forest, benefiting many other species in the process. In 2015, we worked with partners at a number of Brazilian sites, including the Serra Bonita Reserve, Oasis Araripe Reserve, Murici Ecological Station, and Mata do Passarinho Reserve, to help preserve this ecosystem and its remarkable biodiversity.

In 2015, ABC and conservation partner Fundação Biodiversitas expanded the Mata do Passarinho Reserve by 766 acres. Mata do Passarinho—Portuguese for “Songbird Forest”—is the last known home of the critically endangered Stresemann's Bristlefront. With a known population of fewer than 15 individuals, this burrow-nesting bird is one of the most endangered species on the planet.

The area is a haven for many other rare Brazilian birds, including the Banded Cotinga, Brown-backed Parrotlet, Red-browed Parrot, Hook-billed Hermit, and Bahia Tyrannulet. It also shelters numerous rare mammals, including the maned three-toed sloth and the yellow-breasted capuchin monkey, which is listed as critically endangered by IUCN.

At ABC, we continue to step up our work to save rare birds of the Atlantic Forest, benefiting many other species in the process.

The Songbird Forest is also an Alliance for Zero Extinction site, harboring species found only here. It is under constant threat from illegal deforestation, agricultural production, and fires. But with this additional acreage, the reserve now totals 2,352 acres and is an increasingly effective insurance policy against extinction.

HALTING EXTINCTIONS: Highlights

- ABC and partners moved 10 endangered Hawaiian Petrels, or 'Ua'u, to a predator-proof enclosure at Hawai'i's Kilauea Point National Wildlife Refuge—the first step in creating the only fully protected colony of federally listed seabirds anywhere in the Hawaiian Islands. Biologists carefully removed healthy chicks by hand from their mountain burrows, then transported the birds to the coast, where human caretakers fed and monitored the chicks within the enclosure until they fledged. It is hoped that in time, the birds will return to the safety of this predator-free zone to breed.
- Communities in the Cusco region of Peru created a 2,500-acre Private Conservation Area to protect rare birds of the high Andes. The area is the eighth such protected area the localities have formed since 2009 in collaboration with ABC and our Peruvian partner ECOAN. The communities now protect and manage more than 18,000 acres in the Vilcanota Reserve Network, home to such endangered birds as the Ash-breasted Tit-Tyrant.
- We strengthened protection for Colombia's endangered Santa Marta Parakeet by supporting our partner Fundación ProAves' acquisition of a key 148-acre property for this species. That property is also home to the Santa Marta Bush-Tyrant, another endangered bird.
- We continued our extensive forest restoration efforts for the endangered Palila on the Big Island of Hawai'i. Along with the Mauna Kea Forest Restoration Project and hundreds of volunteers, we planted nearly 22,000 native trees and shrubs on Mauna Kea to restore vital habitat for the species. We also supported the planting of nearly 7,000 native plants within the Nakula Natural Area Reserve in preparation for a future translocation of endangered Maui Parrotbills.

Meet ABC Staff:

Hannah Nevins, ABC's Seabird Program Director, has worked as a biologist in Alaska, Antarctica, and New Zealand, but her hometown has always been Santa Cruz, California. Hannah grew up exploring tide pools, creeks, and redwoods—and surfing.

As a young scientist she went to the remote Laysan Island, where nearly a million nesting seabirds greeted her: noddies, terns, frigatebirds with bright-red throat pouches. She was hooked! But she also saw a disturbing number of dead albatrosses that had ingested cigarette lighters, toothbrushes, and other marine debris.

She's inspired to help people understand the impact humans have on seabirds. "Our biggest challenge is to communicate the urgency of the issues—habitat loss, non-native predators, bycatch, and climate change," Hannah says. "I think we can make change happen."

CONSERVING HABITATS

Our habitat conservation efforts benefit birds across the Americas. However, reversing the population declines of migratory birds that require large landscapes in multiple countries is the most challenging conservation issue we face. It requires science, cooperation, and resources on an unprecedented scale. To help migratory birds across their full life cycles, ABC is managing landscapes on birds' breeding and wintering grounds, as well as stopover habitats in between.

Getting Results for Birds—and Butterflies

In Texas and Oklahoma, the ABC-led Oaks and Prairies Joint Venture (OPJV) is working with partners to protect and restore thousands of acres of critical grasslands, benefiting species whose populations have plummeted in the past 50 years.

The Grasshopper Sparrow, Loggerhead Shrike, Eastern Meadowlark, Dickcissel, and many other species are declining in population because of the loss of tallgrass prairie ecosystems in North America. For example, the number of Northern Bobwhite quail has dropped by as much as 90 percent in the last 25 years.

But these declines aren't limited to birds. The monarch butterfly, perhaps the best-known insect species in North America, appears to be in the midst of a population freefall. Researchers estimate the size of the North American migratory monarch population by estimating how many individuals overwinter in Mexico. In 1996, close to 1 billion butterflies made it there. In 2013, that figure dropped to an estimated 35 million—a decline of roughly 96 percent.

Like grassland birds, the butterflies depend on healthy ecosystems that provide just the right mix of plants to meet their needs across their life cycles. "The issue is the same for all of them, which is the loss of native habitat," says Jim Giocomo, ABC Coordinator for the OPJV, a coalition of state and federal agencies and

nonprofit groups that have joined forces to support bird-conservation efforts in Texas and Oklahoma.

Through Texas Parks and Wildlife's Grassland Restoration Incentive Program, in 2013 the OPJV began planning a series of pilot projects in northern

Texas and Oklahoma, collaborating with landowners to rebuild native grasslands. On-the-ground work began in 2015 and flourished throughout the year. Drawing on the expertise and capacity of many partners, including the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service, ABC, and others, the program has restored more than 45,000 acres of grasslands.

Landowners improve the health of the grasslands through prescribed burns, proper grazing and fencing, removing invasive plants, and planting native grasses.

The result? Tallgrass prairies that teem with birds and butterflies—even while cattle continue to graze. Over the next three years, the goal is to bring the total number of acres of working, tallgrass prairies in Texas and Oklahoma to 1 million acres, an area about the size of Montana's Glacier National Park.

CONSERVING HABITATS: Highlights

- Reforestation efforts by ABC, our conservation partner ECOAN, and several local communities in Peru's Vilcanota Mountains achieved a significant milestone in 2015: We have now planted more than 1 million *Polylepis* trees. To help meet this mark, more than 900 people from four communities came together in a tree-planting festival, installing 57,100 saplings in a single day. *Polylepis* forests in the Vilcanota Mountains support a community of endemic and threatened birds, including the Royal Cinclodes and the White-browed Tit-Spintail.
- ABC and two Colombian partners, Fundación ProAves and Fondo para la Acción Ambiental y la Niñez, completed a conservation corridor to provide critical winter habitat for the rapidly declining Cerulean Warbler and more than 150 other bird species, including the Golden-winged Warbler. Over the past ten years, the 6-mile corridor has been reforested with 500,000 seedlings of native trees grown in nurseries at the nearby Cerulean Warbler and Pauxi Pauxi bird reserves. This effort was made possible by the support of Amos Butler Audubon, Elisha Mitchell Audubon,

Indiana Department of Natural Resources, Missouri Department of Conservation, and Southern Wings.

- ABC launched three major collaborative *Bringing Back the Birds* initiatives for priority migratory birds on their breeding and wintering grounds. In the Great Lakes and Eastern forests, we are creating and improving habitat for Golden-winged and Cerulean Warblers and many other species while also conserving their wintering habitats in Latin America.

Across five states in the Gulf of Mexico region, we are restoring declining bird populations by monitoring and protecting critical nesting areas to increase the breeding success of Least Tern, Wilson's and Snowy Plovers, and Black Skimmer.

In the northern Great Plains and Mexico's Chihuahua Desert, we are working to improve breeding and wintering grounds for declining grassland birds, often focusing on Long-billed Curlew to achieve benefits for many species including Sprague's Pipit and Baird's Sparrow.

Our partners in this work include Partners in Flight, the Joint Ventures, public and private land managers, ranchers, and forest management companies.

Meet ABC Staff:

Growing up near Chicago, Jim Giocomo liked math and wanted to be an aquatic biologist. But in college, he discovered that bird population data was more fun—and also meant he could spend his time looking for nests. “Like Easter every day during the breeding season,” says Jim, who is Coordinator of the Oaks and Prairies Joint Venture.

Finding and monitoring bird nests allows Jim to learn something about the personality of individual birds. Even within individual species there is wide variation in the way the parents will respond to visitors. “Some will sneak off the nest quietly, some will make noise to lead you away, and a few will try to scare you away with aggressive displays.” Working in conservation, Jim appreciates that no two days are alike. And when he needs a bit of inspiration, what does he do? He goes birding, of course.

ELIMINATING THREATS

These are not distant problems, but ones that often occur close to home. Collisions with glass windows and wind turbines, free-roaming cats, deadly pesticides, and poorly managed fisheries together kill billions of birds each year. With sound science as our guide, ABC aims to eliminate or significantly reduce these threats by educating the public, policy makers, and government agencies, and by influencing policy, laws, and regulations to benefit birds.

Winning a Legal Battle for Eagles

In 2015, a federal judge in California ruled in favor of American Bird Conservancy in our lawsuit challenging a federal rule that would have allowed wind energy and some other companies to harm or kill Bald and Golden Eagles for up to 30 years without prosecution.

With their eyes on the ground scanning for prey, eagles are among wind energy's unintended victims; more than 2,000 Golden Eagles have perished at California's Altamont Wind Energy Project alone. However, like most birds in the United States, eagles are protected under federal law. Incidental "take" permits exempt companies from prosecution if the birds are harmed.

The court ruled that the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) and the U.S. Department of the Interior violated the National Environmental Policy Act by expanding the maximum duration for eagle take permits six-fold without first assessing the impact those rules would have on the species. The court granted ABC's request to set aside the 30-year rule, handing it back to FWS for further consideration.

A previous rule for eagle-take permits, in place since 2009, had limited their duration to five years. But in 2012, with wind energy on the rise, FWS proposed a new rule that would increase the duration to 30 years and make it easier for companies to get (and keep)

renewable energy facilities on the landscape. Although we at ABC support the expansion of renewable energy in the fight against climate change, we also insist such projects be assessed, sited, adapted, and mitigated to prevent unnecessary bird mortality. ABC and fellow plaintiffs sued the federal agencies in 2014, contending the Department of the Interior did not offer a strong legal or scientific justification for increasing the duration of the permits.

At press time, FWS had reissued plans for the 30-year rule, opening public comment on proposed revisions to the rule that the agency says are now based on science. This important issue for eagles is far from final: Among other things, we are concerned the new plan will still allow the killing of thousands of eagles annually; it also lacks transparency and could prevent public involvement in and oversight of the permitting process. ABC is conducting a comprehensive analysis of the potential impact of the new rule on eagle populations and will submit comments to the FWS.

ELIMINATING THREATS: Highlights

- Despite overwhelming evidence that free-roaming cats have a devastating impact on native wildlife, many lawmakers continue to take up bills that would legalize the abandonment of cats and allocate funds for the management of cat colonies. In 2015, ABC worked in eight states, including Nevada, Rhode Island, and Virginia, to block bills that would have legalized Trap, Neuter, and Release (TNR) programs and allowed the abandonment of feral and free-roaming cats. In New York, a diverse coalition of stakeholders, including ABC, rallied to oppose state funding for TNR legislation. Gov. Andrew Cuomo ultimately vetoed the bill, citing impacts on native wildlife. ABC is grateful to Lynde Uihlein and The Frances V. R. Seebe Charitable Trust for their support of ABC's Cats Indoors Program.
- ABC led more than 100 organizations to urge the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Land Management and the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Forest Service to address a major threat to cavity-nesting birds. Uncapped plastic pipes, which are used to mark the boundaries of more than 3 million mining claims across the western United States, are lethal for many birds. Small birds such as Mountain Bluebird and Ash-throated Flycatcher often see the opening of mining claim markers and other pipes—such as fence posts—as hollows suitable for nesting. The birds enter the narrow holes and become trapped. ABC's long-standing attention to this issue paved the way for progress in early 2016.
- ABC tested 80 food samples from cafeterias in Congress to highlight the pervasiveness of neonicotinoid insecticides in foods we eat and to garner support for the Saving America's Pollinator Act. Of the samples collected, 91 percent tested positive for neonicotinoids. ABC is working with the Harvard School of Public Health, our partner in the study, to have the research peer-reviewed and published in a scientific journal.

Meet ABC Staff:

Michael Hutchins has camped with a million Magellanic Penguins in Patagonia and traversed the Serengeti guiding wildlife tours, but an encounter in Olympic National Park as a doctoral student still astonishes him. A Golden Eagle appeared before Michael on an updraft, hovering only three or four feet from his face. The two stared at each other for a long five seconds before the eagle flew off.

Today, as Director of ABC's Bird Smart Wind Energy Campaign, Michael tries to ensure that wind development doesn't harm eagles like the one he encountered more than 30 years ago. "Our wind energy campaign, which shines a light on the impact of renewable energy on wildlife, is one of ABC's most controversial programs," Michael says. "We need to address climate change—but we also need to protect birds."

Our current list showcases tested, proven products now available to help homeowners and architects identify simple but effective solutions to stop birds from hitting windows. Some of these products are consumer materials meant for homeowners, some are commercial products for architects and building managers, and one is appropriate for both settings.

Stop Birds from Hitting Windows

The list of Bird-Smart Glass products will continue to grow as new products are tested and found effective. BUILDING CAPACITY

ABC plays a unique role in the bird conservation community. In 2015, by investing in other organizations with our own time and resources, we helped 19 partners in Latin America and the Caribbean become stronger financially, organizationally, and programmatically. We also brought wide-ranging groups together to achieve more for birds than we could accomplish alone. Helping to raise funds, sponsoring science, building coalitions—all of these actions ultimately produce results that benefit birds.

Reducing Seabird Bycatch

Scientists estimate roughly 720,000 seabirds are caught on hooks or tangled in nets each year. This is called seabird bycatch, and it can be devastating to seabird populations. Many of these birds are long-lived species with low reproductive rates, and can be slow to replace individuals that are lost.

To help solve the problem of seabird bycatch in commercial fisheries, in 2015 ABC launched a new website, Seabird Maps and Information for Fisheries (fisheryandseabird.info). Created in collaboration with The Pennsylvania State University's Center for Environmental Informatics, the site puts a wealth of information helpful in reducing bycatch right at the fingertips of those who need it most: fishermen, conservationists, and those promoting fishery sustainability.

Seabirds are among the most threatened groups of birds. Approximately 29 percent of seabird species are listed in the IUCN Red List categories Critically Endangered, Endangered, and Vulnerable. These include the albatrosses (15 of 22 species are threatened), such as the magnificent Waved Albatross, and even the colorful Atlantic Puffin, recently listed as Vulnerable.

Featuring a database with profiles of all 378 seabird species, the website offers a unique way to access a wealth of information. Users draw a map that outlines

an area of interest, then with one click, can see a list of seabirds known to occur in that geographic area, along with useful information for assessing the risk posed to seabirds by fishing gear.

With information available on each species, fisheries managers can make changes to their fishing methods and help to reduce bycatch.

With so much information available on each species, fisheries managers can make changes to their fishing methods. Fishermen using longlines with many baited hooks, for instance, could consider adding streamer lines—brightly colored streamers suspended over the area where hooks are being set—to scare birds away from the longlines. Or they could set their lines or nets at night, when birds such as albatrosses are less active.

The tool also allows users to review seabirds' legal protected status by country, along with their population sizes and range maps; access reports with information such as diving depth and diet (which may indicate the risk posed by certain kinds of fishing gear); view nations' protected areas or Exclusive Economic Zones; and find resources on how to reduce bycatch.

BUILDING CAPACITY: Highlights

- In early 2015, in partnership with the March Conservation Fund, ABC launched the new Latin American Reserve Stewardship Initiative (LARSI) to provide funding and ABC mentoring that will strengthen the sustainability of bird conservation organizations in Latin America and the Caribbean. LARSI will provide \$300,000 a year to our partners to work on strengthening their organizations and reserves where they need it most, supporting fundraising development, training, website development, and generating unrestricted income through tourism, honey production, and other activities. Nine partners received LARSI support in 2015. To maximize the program's impact, ABC also coordinated the sustainability grants with two other major partners: the Jeniam Foundation and World Land Trust.
- ABC hosted a fundraising training "boot camp" for seven Latin American partners, which included a practice session where partners pitched projects to a panel of real donors. As a result, Fundación ProAves successfully fundraised for land acquisition at Tanagers Reserve (Colombia) from one of the panelists. Following the workshop, Instituto Uiraçu's new director raised thousands of dollars from a U.S. chocolate company, triggering match commitments totaling \$25,000 for the group's Serra Bonita Reserve in Brazil.
- ABC and Birdlife International received a major multi-year grant through the United Nations Environment Program from the Global Environment Facility to help governments around the world include protection of Alliance for Zero Extinction (AZE) sites in their strategies for biodiversity conservation. We will also analyze where critically endangered and endangered bird species occur outside protected areas and promote the protection of these species among government and NGO partners. Initial efforts will focus on Brazil, Chile, and Mexico to develop and implement field conservation projects.

Meet ABC Staff:

David Wiedenfeld has been drawn to birds ever since he was a child growing up in Texas, where Long-billed Curlews wintered in the fields behind his house. As ABC's Senior Conservation Scientist, David works to design, monitor, and evaluate projects, helping to ensure our success.

Before joining ABC in 2007 he lived and worked in the Galapagos Islands as Head of the Department of Vertebrate Ecology at the Charles Darwin Research Station. The archipelago's birds and other animals are remarkably fearless. A Galapagos Hawk once flew in half a mile and landed about 10 feet away, David says, "just to see what these odd, big, two-legged animals were doing on its island."

Although climate change and human population growth are tremendous challenges for bird conservation, David says, "The biggest opportunity is people's growing awareness that nature is threatened and needs help."

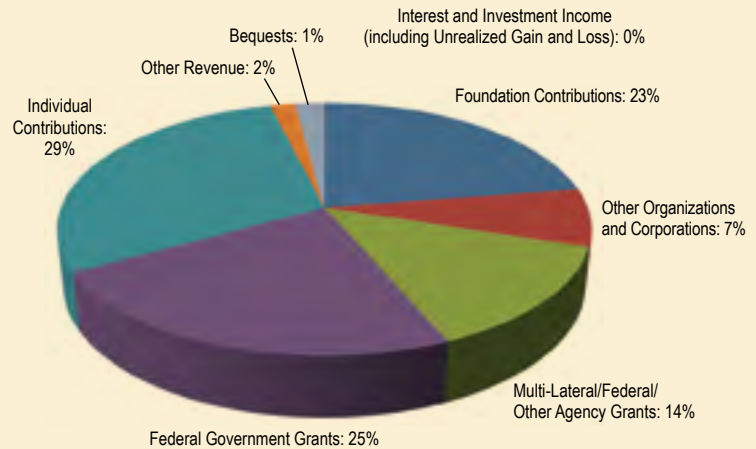

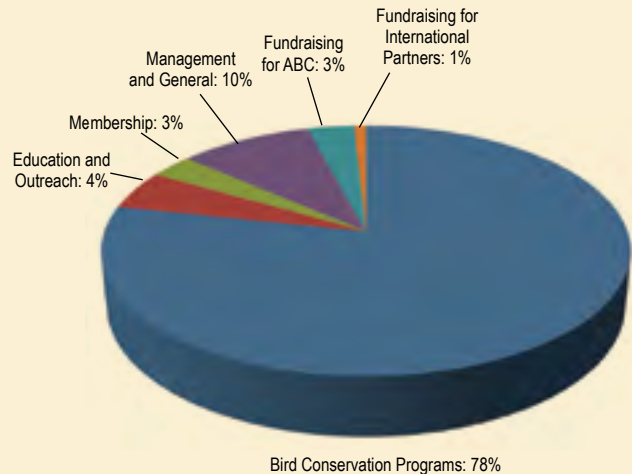
