AMERICAN BIRD CONSERVANCY MICROCHIP REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

Microchips offer a safe and convenient form of domestic cat identification that has been shown to increase the likelihood of a lost cat being reunited with its owner.^{i,ii} Despite this benefit, however, only 25% of pet cats in Maine are currently microchipped.ⁱⁱⁱ

To help facilitate recovery of lost cats, thereby keeping cats safe and reducing potential conflicts with birds and other wildlife, American Bird Conservancy's <u>Cats Indoors program</u> is proud to help defray the cost of microchipping pet cats in Maine. Through August 2021 (or until funds run out), American Bird Conservancy will reimburse 50% of the cost to microchip a pet cat (up to \$20.00/cat) for Maine residents.
