

# AMERICAN BIRD CONSERVANCY

## MICROCHIP REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

Microchips offer a safe and convenient form of domestic cat identification that has been shown to increase the likelihood of a lost cat being reunited with its owner.<sup>i,ii</sup> Despite this benefit, however, only 25% of pet cats in Maine are currently microchipped.<sup>iii</sup>

To help facilitate recovery of lost cats, thereby keeping cats safe and reducing potential conflicts with birds and other wildlife, American Bird Conservancy's [Cats Indoors program](#) is proud to help defray the cost of microchipping pet cats in Maine. Through April 2022 (or until funds run out), **American Bird Conservancy will reimburse 100% of the cost to microchip a pet cat (up to \$40.00/cat) for Maine residents.**
